## Three Suspects Arrested for Early Morning Burglary


On Friday, September 7, shortly before 7 am, police responded to 127 Pickwick Avenue, the Tobacco Zone for a burglary. When officers arrived, they observed the front glass door to the business had been shattered. Officers spoke with a witness on scene, who stated they observed a subject exit the business carrying merchandise. Officers canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspect. Investigators responded and after reviewing store security video, determined that two suspects had entered the business and were able to identify a possible suspect vehicle.

Several hours later, a patrol officer stopped a vehicle matching the description of the one used in the crime. Investigators were able to determine that the two adults and one juvenile that were in the vehicle were responsible for the crime.


Brian L. Burijon, DOB 2/21/1992, was charged with the following offenses: Breaking & Entering, Conspiracy. He was released on an unsecured bond.

Nicholas F. Wilt, DOB 3/18/1994 was charged with the following offenses: Breaking & Entering, Conspiracy, Destruction of Property, Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor. He was incarcerated at Riverside Regional Jail.

A 17 year old juvenile was also charged with the following offenses: Breaking & Entering, Conspiracy, Destruction of Property, Wearing a Mask in Public, Possession of a Firearm by a Juvenile, Altering the serial number on a firearm, Possession of a Concealed Weapon, Petit Larceny and Conspiracy.
