5. Vote To Come Back Into Open Meeting cont.:


Consideration of the following certification:

Each member will now certify that to the best of the member's knowledge (i) only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements of the act and (ii) only such public business matters as were identified in the motion by which the closed meeting was convened were heard, discussed or considered in the meeting by the public body. Any member who believes there was a departure from the requirements of clauses (i) and (ii), shall so state prior to the vote, indicating the substance of the departure that, in his judgment, has taken place.

Roll Call. An affirmative vote shall constitute certification of compliance.







Cigarette Tax Information

Authorization

- * Chapter 38, Article 7 of the Code of Virginia provides authority for cities to charge a cigarette tax.

Cigarette Tax Information – Other Cities

- * Summary information from some other Virginia cities that charge a cigarette tax shows rates ranging from a low of 14 cents up to 90 cents per pack, while surrounding counties do not have a cigarette tax.
- * Sam's Club in Colonial Heights sells cigarettes wholesale to business in Petersburg.
- * Colonial Heights businesses may also be purchasing wholesale from Sam's.

Cigarette Tax Information, cont.

Staff Recommendation

- * Staff's recommendation to Council is to implement a 35 cents per pack cigarette tax beginning in FY 19-20.
- * Estimated revenue for the City of Colonial Heights is \$460,000 at this rate.
- * Funding will provide the City with a much needed revenue stream that diversifies our revenue base and that can help address public safety staffing and other budget needs.

Cigarette Tax Information, cont.

Revenue Estimate Research

- * Staff analyzed the cigarette tax revenue collected by other cities as compared to their retail sales tax revenue.
- * Sales tax serves as a proxy to measure the retail activity, which would directly impact the volume of cigarette sales.
- * Staff used these comparisons of the cigarette tax revenue received per penny with the level of sales tax received from other communities to help estimate cigarette tax revenue.

Cigarette Tax Information, cont.

Implementation

- * **Administration** - If approved by Council, cigarette stamps would be sold to wholesalers by the City and be required to be placed on packs purchased for resale on or after July 1, 2019.
- * **Stamps** – The City would purchase the printed stamps to sell to the wholesalers that sell cigarettes to businesses in the City.
- * Staff would recommend that a discount be provided to purchasers of the stamps to offset the cost of affixing the stamps to the cigarettes.
- * The tax stamps do not have to be attached by the City, but can be sold by the City to the wholesalers/retailers who can attach the stamps.
- * The City collects revenue for the tax when the stamps are sold to wholesalers or directly to retailers.


- * **Enforcement** – The Commissioner of Revenue could potentially conduct site visits to ensure proper labeling.

Action for Tonight's Meeting

- * Staff recommends approval from Council for bringing forward an Ordinance for implementation of a 35 cents per pack cigarette tax for FY 19-20.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS REGARDING TRASH & RECYCLING CAN PLACEMENT

§ 244-14 SUPERVISION OF COLLECTION; CANS AND CONTAINERS



§ 244-14 (E)

SUPERVISION OF COLLECTION; CANS AND CONTAINERS

Solid waste shall be placed in the manner required by this section in the City right-of-way between the extended side lot lines of, and in front of, the residence or commercial establishment from which it is to be collected, unless some other public place, including but not limited to a location near or in an alley in the rear of the property, has been designated for a specific residence or commercial establishment by the Director of Public Works in the interest of the public or convenience and safety.

In no event shall any solid waste can or container, or recycling can or container, be placed in the City right-of-way, or other designated place, prior to 12:00 noon of the day preceding the scheduled collection day. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "solid waste" shall include tree limbs, shrubbery, brush cuttings, hedge trimmings, lawn rakings, leaves and similar materials, which are regulated by § 244-21 of this Code. All solid waste cans and containers, and recycling cans and containers, after being emptied, shall be removed from the City right-of-way by the owners or tenants by 7:00 p.m. of the day following collection. Except for the time period specified in this subsection that a can or container may remain in the City right-of-way, all solid waste and recycling cans and containers shall remain in a location behind the front plane of the residence or business.

The Director of the Department of Planning and Community Development or his designee shall enforce these provisions relating to the placement in, and removal from, the City right-of-way of cans and containers.

§ 244-14 (G)

SUPERVISION OF COLLECTION; CANS AND CONTAINERS

The Director of the Department of Planning and Community Development or his designee (the "Director") shall send any owner or tenant who violates the provisions of this section a warning letter by first-class mail for the owner's or tenant's first violation during a calendar year.

The letter shall advise the owner or tenant that he shall remedy the violation within 10 calendar days. If the owner or tenant fails to remedy the violation within 10 calendar days, or if the owner or tenant commits a second violation within the same calendar year, the Director shall impose a civil penalty of \$50 upon the violator; and such penalty shall be paid within 30 calendar days.


The Department of Finance shall notify the violator of the penalty and the thirty-day payment period in a letter sent by first-class mail. If the \$50 civil penalty is not paid within 30 days, the Department of Finance shall add the penalty to the owner's or tenant's bi-monthly water and sewer bill. The Director is authorized to promulgate policies and procedures to administer and enforce these penalty provisions.

PRIVATE STREETS

- HOA provides enforcement of HOA codes in private communities.
- Trash/Recycling can placement will be enforced on public streets, but not on private streets.

ATTACHED HOUSING



- Attached housing on separate parcels
- No common area parcel for access to side/rear
- Public street
- Currently, containers are stored by front doors.

ATTACHED HOUSING CABELL DRIVE

ATTACHED HOUSING GILCREFF PLACE

- Attached housing is on separate parcels
- Common parcel does not provide access to rear yards
- However, Gilcreff Place is a private street community
- Currently, containers are stored in front or in garage





ATTACHED HOUSING BRANDERS BRIDGE APARTMENTS

Branders Bridge Apartments

- Attached housing on separate parcels per building
- Common parcel provides access to side and rear
- Currently, dumpsters are used at this site.

ATTACHED HOUSING WILLOW RUN TOWNHOUSES (FAIRFAX AVE)

- Parcel lines not associated to specific units. The 5 parcels that make up this site act as one common parcel under single ownership.
- Common parcel provides access to side and rear.
- Currently, containers are stored in the public right-of-way on Fairfax Avenue. Previously, the management company stored containers on the concrete pad in front of the building.


CVWMA PICK-UP SERVICE

- CVWMA has a special pick-up service to accommodate those who cannot bring their cans back and forth to the curb.
 - 114 households for recycling pick-up.
 - 110 households for trash pick-up
- CVWMA specifies that location of the cart must be in the sightline of the driver.
- This list is updated on a monthly basis.


CVWMA PICK-UP SERVICE

Two choices in policy decision:

- **Compliance.** The side of the house is within sightline of the driver and therefore a household on the pick-up list can use the pick-up service while being in compliance with this code.
- **Exemption.** Exempt all households on the pick-up list.

IMPLEMENTATION

“UNROLLING CAN PLACEMENT ENFORCEMENT”

- The enforcement of can placement is assigned as a supplemental task to the Code Enforcement.
Continuing the proactive enforcement of the City's codes is priority.
- The first year of enforcement of can placement is a “trial” to determine if additional staffing or policies is necessary.
- Stage One – reactive enforcement of can placement.
- Stage Two – proactive enforcement of can placement, which will be done street-by-street.
- Please note, over 300 violations were found in a sample area of the City (Sherwood Hills, neighborhoods directly off of Boulevard that are north of the rail crossing)



RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING THE CONTAINER PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

- **ATTACHED HOUSING ON SEPARATE PARCELS –**


Recommend an ordinance amendment for attached housing with units located on separate parcels to revise the requirement to bring trash/recycling cans behind the front plane of the structure to allow the cans to be located near the front of the structure.

- **CONSIDERATION OF PROPERTIES ON CVWMA LIST**

- Recommend that the properties on the CVWMA porch pick-up list be exempted from the requirement to bring trash/recycling cans behind the front plane of the structure.


