

COUNCIL COLUMN

As your new councilman, I sincerely thank each of you for your confidence and your vote. I take my post very seriously and promise to extend my best efforts to better serve you.

You may not be aware, but our city is governed by the state under the “Dillon Rule”, which means “localities can only wield powers explicitly authorized to them by the state”. That approach has hamstrung cities, including ours, that wish to solve some of the most pressing problems for our residents. As such, our state mandates many rules and procedures that we must follow and local governments cannot deviate from state requirements. I advocate for a change to “Home Rule”, which greatly strengthens the authority to our local government and prevents state government intervention. We know our needs, conditions, and issues that we face and where we can effectively bring forth decisions that meet our specific needs.

My campaign was built on several improvement needs that include infrastructure and economic growth. “Costs for water and sewer infrastructure are estimated at 188 million dollars over a 25-year period; costs for general road improvements would be in addition to this. Our citizens have carried a lot of the cost burden for operation of our city through tax revenues, and I do not support increased taxes for anyone. Our city is limited on land development and we must focus on re-development. We can be the “Commerce Hub” for economic growth in the tri-city area as interstates I-95 and I-85 are in her back yard where we must capitalize. Often in my travels when I see a successful business, I speak directly to the manager, providing contact information to our city Economic Development Administrator with an invitation to locate here. I encourage each of you to support our city and invite businesses that you would like to see locate here.

Petersburg has a planned pharmaceutical manufacturing plant and I support growth opportunities here where we can provide associate companies and services for this industry.

Our city has a lot to offer with great schools, staff, and excellent recreation opportunities. We need economic growth.

I appreciate the opportunity to serve you and I wish you all a Very Merry Christmas and a Happy, Safe, and Prosperous New Year.


Winter Care Tips for Your Pets Colonial Heights Animal Services

As our region approaches the colder season many people begin adjusting their daily clothing as they don jackets, winter gloves and mittens. We would like to take a moment to share some tips about how to ensure your pets are safe and healthy over the winter.



- Limit Time Outdoors – We understand that some animals have too much energy to be kept inside all day, however when the temperature drops it is safer to limit their outdoor play time. Your dog's paws, tail and ears are very susceptible to frost-bite.
- Check your vehicle for cats – In colder weather, cats have been known to seek shelter and warmth inside vehicles. Please take the time to check around your vehicle before hitting the road.
- Provide Shelter – If a dog must be kept outside, please provide adequate shelter and insulating material. We recommend using straw instead of a blanket as it retains heat more efficiently and does not retain water and freeze as easily as fabric. If any resident of Colonial Heights needs straw for their animal, they are asked to please contact the shelter at 804-520-9397 as they are often able to provide straw as part of their community outreach program.
- Be Aware of Chemicals Used in Winter. Many chemicals such as ice melt are toxic to animals and can cause damage to the delicate skin on their paws. Please consider using non-toxic alternatives and always check and clean your dog's paws when they are brought inside after being exposed to any area that may contain harmful chemicals.
- Remember, if it is too cold for you, it is probably too cold for your pet, so if at all possible we recommend keeping your pet indoors during the colder months. If left outdoors, pets can freeze, become disoriented, lost, injured or killed.

Your Colonial Heights Animal Services employees are always working hard to keep all the animals at the shelter clean, happy and safe. Donations are always welcome, especially cleaning products, dry dog and cat food and wet cat food.

FROM THE BILLING & COLLECTIONS DEPARTMENT WINTER 2022 - IMPORTANT DATES

The 2022 Colonial Heights dog and cat tags are due January 31, 2022. A valid rabies certificate and spay/neuter documentation (if applicable) must be presented.

The cost of a 1-year tag will be as follows:

- Dog or Cat tags: \$10.00 each
- Neutered or spayed tags: \$2.00 each

The cost of a 2-year tag (*if qualified) will be as follows:

- Dog or Cat tags: \$20.00 each
- Neutered or spayed tags: \$4.00 each

The cost of a 3-year tag (*if qualified) will be as follows:

- Dog or Cat tags: \$30.00
- Neutered or spayed tags: \$6.00

**In order to purchase a 2- or 3- year tag, the rabies must expire in 2023 for a 2 year tag and 2024 for 3 year tag.*

These tags may be purchased through the mail or in person at City Hall. If by mail, please enclose copies of the necessary documents with your payment, and we will mail the tags back to you.

All tags must be purchased by January 31, 2022 to avoid a 25% late fee charge.

FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

Thank you to our citizens and businesses that were patient and understanding as we processed our first Personal Property bills utilizing our new financial software.

By the time you receive the winter edition of the Focus, you should have received the second half and supplemental billing for 2021 personal property taxes. Keep our office up to date on all your purchases when they occur to avoid additional bills and late fees. As always, our goal is to get it right every time and we need your help in doing so. For 100% disabled Veterans, one passenger vehicle that you own or co-own is exempt from personal property tax. Please keep us updated on which vehicle you would like exempt if you own more than one. Active Duty military with an out of state Home of Record, you must provide us with a current LES to be exempt from personal property taxes and license fees.

As always, remember, there is nothing that we cannot fix or make correct, so please be patient as we navigate these new waters. It will get smoother, I promise. As we approach the end of the 2021 tax year, please keep in mind that due to the short supply of new automobiles, the values of used automobiles, in many cases, have increased. This is not the normal pattern and it is projected by used car valuation experts, that the trend will continue into 2022.

Due dates will remain the same, tax rates remain the same and what you must do as citizens and taxpayers remains the same.

- It is the taxpayer who is responsible for notifying this office of new purchases as well as personal property sold, not DMV or a car dealer.
- New business owners are required to get a Business License prior to opening.
- Renewal of existing Business Licenses is required by March 1
- You must keep your name and address updated at DMV. Changes are required by State Law within 30 days. You can do that on the DMVNow website.
- Colonial Heights does not pro-rate personal property tax. If you owned the vehicle or other property on January 1, 2021, you will pay taxes for the entire year in Colonial Heights regardless of when you move or when you sold it.

2022 Community Center and Park Pavilion Reservations

We will begin accepting reservations for the Community Center and Park Pavilions for the 2022 calendar year on Wednesday December 1st.

For Community Center rentals you must be a Colonial Heights Resident. The Community Center is available on weekdays Monday-Friday from 4:30pm-9:00pm on a limited basis. Weekend rentals are available in two time blocks, either 8:00am-2:00pm or 3:00pm-9:00pm. The rental fee for each rental block, including weekdays, is \$100 and is due at the time of reservation. Staff will be on-site during your rental to help provide assistance with your rental and to unlock and secure the building.

For Park Pavilion rentals, there is a \$15 rental fee for City Residents, and a \$50 rental fee for non-Residents. Park Pavilions are available for rent daily.

To rental a Recreation & Parks facility please contact our office at (804)520-9390, proof of residency is required.

Neighborhood Leaf Removal Service

Fall 2021/Winter 2022

Convenient Service during Fall Season

The City of Colonial Heights Department of Public Works is pleased to announce that convenient leaf removal services will be provided in city neighborhoods again this year. Each fall, residents collect and stockpile loose leaves along city streets, which city crews remove and make available to local recycling businesses. During the 2020/21 season, city crews collected approximately 2,500 cubic yards of leaves.

Year Round Service Option

Bagged leaves are collected year round and may be placed at the curbside on regular trash collection days. The limit per collection day is 30 bags, each weighing no more than 50 pounds.

Neighborhood Service Areas

This year leaf removal operations will occur in three main service areas, each consisting of three to four neighborhoods. **Figure 1 (See Page 9)** shows the service areas and schedules. Signs will be installed on adjacent thoroughfares to let residents know in advance when service is scheduled in their area. Please note that the time for service in each area is subject to change depending on inclement weather conditions and other events beyond the City's control. Please stay tuned to our 'In the News' section of the website, as well as, our Facebook page. You can also sign up for notices by registering for important updates (see page 3 for information on registering for CivicReady and Notify Me).

Scheduled Time of Service

Leaves will be collected and removed during the hours of 7:30 AM and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday, beginning November 15, 2021 and ending February 14, 2022 except on holidays.

Preparing Leaves for City Collection

Residents are asked to place leaves along street frontages and roadsides one week before service is scheduled to begin in their neighborhood, *as only one (1) pass will be made on each street during the scheduled collection service for the area*. No leaves will be removed except during regularly scheduled times. Leaves that are not placed before regularly scheduled removal times will be removed during the next regularly scheduled service in the area. City crews cannot remove leaves from private property.

Avoid Mixing Leaves with Other Debris

Residents are asked to keep leaf piles free of tree branches, lumber, steel, rock, concrete or other debris. Hard objects mixed with leaves are hazardous and may damage leaf vacuum equipment causing unnecessary time and expense to repair or replace.

Neighborhood Parking During Leaf Removal Service

Residents can assist city leaf removal operations by keeping parked vehicles clear of leaf piles. The use of off-street parking is encouraged wherever available. "No Parking" signs may be used to restrict parking on neighborhood streets while city crews remove leaf piles. To avoid damaging personal property, city crews will not rake leaf piles out from under or between parked cars.




