

COUNCIL COLUMN

Dear Colonial Heights residents and community members,

I cannot believe that we are already heading into the Fall season of 2022! Soon the leaves will be changing and the weather will begin to get cooler. Our summer here in the City has been busy and we have seen our fare share of changes.

We continue to transition to a new trash service with Waste Management through our contract with Central Virginia Waste Management (CVWMA). We know that this has been a tedious process for our entire community, and we appreciate your patience as they worked out routes and other community needs. We will continue to monitor the service agreement to ensure compliance and customer service is being met. Please remember that you can process a request for an additional cart and bulk waste collection directly through the CVWMA website by visiting the Colonial Heights page at <https://cvwma.com/cvwma-locations/colonial-heights/>.

City Council was aware of the increasing used car values on personal property tax bills, resulting in higher personal property tax amounts. To help offset the increase, City Council approved a decrease in the personal property tax rate from \$3.50 per \$100 of assessed value to \$3.10 for calendar year 2022.

At the request of City Council, the Public Works and Engineering Department have been extremely busy working on street maintenance projects, in the southern end of the city. A majority of the streets paved and resurfaced were around the Flora Hill Park area as well as Westover Avenue and surrounding streets.

One thing that hasn't changed this year is our City's ability to sustain excellent financial reviews and audits. The City received its 42nd consecutive Government Finance Officers Association Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting. This is the highest form of recognition in government accounting and financial reporting.

To help protect our community, our Colonial Heights Public Library continues to offer free COVID-19 test kits to anyone in need. Please continue to monitor your symptoms and maintain CDC guidelines to help protect you, your family, and our community.

Moving forward into this new season, I want to personally invite you all to come out and enjoy our fun-filled family weekend of events at the Annual Fort Clifton Festival which is now being held on Saturday, Sep. 24 and Sunday, Sep. 25th. I hope to see you there!

5 THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT GETTING YOUR HURRICANE SUPPLIES

-  **1** Food/Water - Get supplies well in advance, enough for each person for at least one week.

- 2** Medicine/First-aid - Have 30 days worth of medicines and medical supplies. Fill prescriptions before the storm.

- 3** Communications - Have extra batteries or portable chargers for your cell phones and batteries for your radios.

- 4** Gas - Fill up your car or a gas can beforehand. If the power goes out, you will be unable to pump gas.

- 5** Money - Have cash on hand. With no electricity, ATMs and credit cards will not work.

Hurricane Season in Virginia is June 1-November 30

Forecasters at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) predicts above-normal 2022 Atlantic Hurricane Season. 'For the 2022 hurricane season, NOAA is forecasting a likely range of 14 to 21 named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher), of which 6 to 10 could become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3 to 6 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; with winds of 111 mph or higher). NOAA provides these ranges with a 70% confidence.' (<https://www.noaa.gov>) Gov. Glenn Youngkin is telling Virginians across the commonwealth to start preparing for extreme weather now.






OFFICE ON YOUTH

Youth Advisory Council

Here in the community of Colonial Heights, the Office on Youth offers leadership programs such as the Youth Advisory Council also known as YAC. YAC is offered to students between the grades of 6-12th. YAC is extremely involved in the community and has participated in programs such as providing lunch for the Tri-Cities Work Camp program, participating in Colonial Heights High School Volunteer-a-thon and working with the community during back to school events, street and city clean ups and providing take home kits from the library. YAC currently accepts applications on a rolling basis and will meet the last Thursday of each month in Council Chambers at 6:30pm.

CADRE

CADRE is a volunteer civic organization that is dedicated to the prevention of substances abuse among the youth. CADRE addressed underage drinking, smoking and the illegal use of drugs. CADRE serves both the youth and adults of Colonial Heights. CADRE participates in community activities such as Project Sticker Shock and Youth Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Project (YADAPP).

Project Sticker Shock is a prevention program that involves the youth placing sticker warnings that address the penalties of furnishing alcohol to minors. The youth have been participating in the program since 2011. We collaborate with retailers and law enforcement officers with the hope to educate and raise awareness to furnishers and retailers.

YADAPP is a peer-led program for high school students to address the risk of underage substance use. YADAPP participants attend a week long summer kick-off conference that will assist with the developing of strategic prevention plans that will address underage drug and alcohol use in the schools and communities. Participants will meet and interact with their like-minded peers during classroom and breakout sessions, and will learn from motivational speakers. After the conferences YADAPP participants will plan to utilize their leadership and acquired knowledge to educate and prevent substance abuse.

COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

Thank you to our citizens and businesses that were patient and understanding as we processed our first round of Personal Property bills (2021) utilizing our new financial software. Many of you know that our second billing (2022) has taken place and a new series of issues has arisen with our assessment software. Thank you again to the many citizens and businesses who were patient while we worked through those issues with your bills, again. Please be confident that we are doing everything in our power to make sure future assessments and billings go smoothly.

We continue to rely on you telling us all year long when you do buy and sell or otherwise dispose of vehicles or other personal property. We are unsure at this time, if we will be able to send out that "Blue" form in the future, however, we know it did not happen this year. So, to save us all a lot of time and apprehension, I continue to ask you to let us know about any changes to your address or what you own as soon after they occur as possible. It remains our goal to get it right every time and we need your help in doing so. 100% disabled Veterans, one passenger vehicle that you own or co-own is exempt from personal property tax. Please keep us updated on which vehicle you would like exempt if you own more than one. You will still be billed for the License Fee. Active Duty military with an out of state HOR, you must provide us with a current LES to be exempt from personal property taxes and license fees. As always, remember, there is nothing that we cannot fix or make correct, so please be patient as we navigate these new waters. It will get smoother, I promise. As I noted in the Spring Edition, the continued short supply of new and used automobiles has resulted in record breaking INCREASES in the values of used automobiles. Experts say an average INCREASE of 37%, so please do not be taken by surprise. This is not the normal pattern and it is projected by used car valuation experts, that the trend will continue well into 2023.

As an effort to ease the tax burden from rising vehicle values, Council reduced the personal property tax from \$3.50 to \$3.10. In addition, they extended the first installment due date, to July 29th.

Some helpful tips and reminders pertaining to personal property taxes and business licenses.

Personal Property:

- You must notify the Commissioner of Revenue's office when purchasing and selling personal property. This is essential to ensure your annual personal property bills are accurate. Neither DMV (Department Motor Vehicles) or a car dealer can update our business system.
- You must keep your name and address updated at DMV. All changes must be completed within 30 days in accordance to Virginia State Law. You do have the option of making those changes online at DMVNow.com website.
- Colonial Heights does not pro-rate personal property tax. If you owned the vehicle or other Personnel property on January 1, 2021, you will pay taxes for the entire year regardless of when you moved or sold the property.

Business Licenses:

- New business owners are required to get a Business License prior to opening.
- Renewal of existing Business Licenses is required by March 1st.

NEIGHBORHOOD LEAF REMOVAL

Convenient Service During Fall Season

The City of Colonial Heights Department of Public Works is pleased to announce that convenient leaf removal services will be provided in city neighborhoods again this year. Each fall, residents collect and stockpile loose leaves along city streets, which city crews remove and make available to local recycling businesses. During the 2021/22 season, city crews collected approximately 2,500 cubic yards of leaves.

Bagged Leaves (Require Bulk Waste Service Request)

Bagged leaves that are not placed inside trash carts are considered "bulk waste".

- A bulk waste service request must be completed by 2:00pm on the Tuesday before collection.
- Call **CVWMA at (804)340-0900** or submit a bulk waste request online at <https://cvwma.com/cvwma-locations/colonial-heights/>
- Bagged leaves may be collected year round and may be placed at the curbside with regular trash cart on regular trash collection days if a bulk waste service request is submitted on-time.

Neighborhood Service Areas

Leaf removal operations will occur in three main service areas, each consisting of three to four neighborhoods. (See page 11 for service areas and schedules)

- Signs will be installed on adjacent thoroughfares to let residents know in advance when service is scheduled in their area.
- Service timeframes in each area are subject to change depending on inclement weather conditions and other events beyond the City's control.

Fall Curbside (Loose-Leaf) Collection Service Hours

Leaves will be collected and removed from 7:30 AM through 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday, beginning November 14, 2022 and ending February 13, 2023 except on holidays (weather delays may affect this collection schedule).

Preparing Leaves for City Collection

- Residents are asked to **place leaf piles behind the curb or the edge of pavement along the street** one week before service is scheduled to begin in their neighborhood, as **only one (1) pass** will be made on each street during the scheduled collection service for the area.
- Leaves that are not placed out before regularly scheduled removal times will be removed during the next regularly scheduled service in the area.
- City crews cannot remove leaves from private property, so leaf piles must be placed behind the curb or the edge of pavement along the street which is the city right-of-way.
- Leaf piles need to be free of tree branches, lumber, steel, rock, concrete or other debris. (Hard objects mixed with leaves are hazardous and may damage leaf vacuum equipment causing unnecessary time and expense to repair or replace.

Neighborhood Parking During Leaf Removal Service

Residents can assist city leaf removal operations by keeping parked vehicles clear of leaf piles. The use of off-street parking is encouraged wherever available. "No Parking" signs may be used to restrict parking on neighborhood streets while city crews remove leaf piles. To avoid damaging personal property, city crews will not rake leaf piles out from under or between parked cars.
