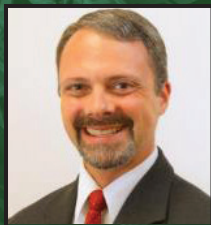

COUNCIL COLUMN



Greetings Friends,

I want to thank each of you who voted in the recent election. Voting is a privilege to voice your choice in leadership and the laws that govern us. I also want to thank all the volunteers and poll workers.

As the holiday season nears, it is a great time to reflect upon the accomplishments of the past year.

Infrastructure improvements continue with roadway pavement in the southern and northern end of the city. Lakeview Avenue, Dupuy Avenue, and the addition of a turn lane on Westover Avenue are complete. Presently, repaving around Shepherd Stadium, Conduit Road and Hamilton Avenue are in process. The city applied and obtained state and federal grant funds for the first three projects which paid the majority of the costs, saving our tax payer dollars. Paving during warmer months ensures the best in quality and durability. Council is very concerned about our roads and infrastructure needs. Sanitary sewer lining on several streets is underway and will continue. Sidewalks are being added on portions of Conduit Road, Roanoke Avenue and the Boulevard with goals for additional future sidewalks.

My last report to you mentioned a comprehensive plan submitted to the Virginia Department of Transportation for improvement of the roundabout on Temple Avenue including installation of three lighted flag poles and low growth plantings. Also, clean up around the pond at the I-95 interchange adding a large lighted sign and water fountain. I'm sorry to say, permit delay from the state has been incurred however; I will continue to aggressively pursue approval for completion.

Several key initiatives have been added to aid our Police Department in crime solving and locating missing persons. Our Fire and EMS Departments have maintained excellent response times reducing health and injury emergencies and reducing property damage.

Regarding renovations at Violet Bank, the first phase was completed for foundation and roof repairs. The second phase is underway which includes exterior work and related finishings. Our Parks and Recreation Department is to be commended for seeking grants for these renovations which are now in the review and approval stage.

Replacement of a new van for our senior citizens at the Community Building is underway and grant funding was also obtained further saving tax dollars. A special "Thank You" to all the grant donors for their contributions.

Our city has maintained its credit rating of AA+ which, proves Council is serious about operating within the budget. Annually, Council spends several months reviewing each budget item to ensure your tax dollars are properly utilized.

Council is very concerned regarding inflationary costs just as you are facing within your household. We aggressively search for all available grants and funds from outside sources in order to save your tax dollars while providing the best living conditions possible. Council is not in favor of increasing tax rates.

We are your representatives who listens and responds to problems with solutions, not excuses or rumor mill comments from social media. Your voice matters and you are welcome to attend City Council meetings and weigh in on your ideas and concerns. If you would like to participate on a specific committee, please go to the city website and complete an application.

Finally, we are grateful for the last 75 years. Colonial Heights incorporation has been a success and our goal is to continue to build on that foundation. We are grateful for your partnership.

Serving as your vice-mayor, I have been honored to serve you with the opportunity to work with high caliber men and women of our City Council and staff.

On behalf of City Council we wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a safe and blessed New Year.

Prevent Package theft this Holiday Season!



As online shopping becomes more prevalent in our society, a new trend has also increased nationwide. This trend, which is commonly known as “porch piracy” occurs when a package has been successfully delivered to the intended recipient, however that package, often left unattended for hours while the resident is away from the house, is stolen by criminals who regularly practice this type of theft.

It is important for community members to understand the tactics employed by porch pirates, in order to reduce the likelihood of falling victim to these thefts. Here are some helpful tips which can allow you to avoid becoming a victim to porch piracy.

Choose a Secure Deliver Option: Many shipping carriers offer delivery options requiring a signature for delivery or delivering the items to a secure locker.

Track and Schedule Deliveries: Utilize the tracking services provided by carriers to stay updated on estimated delivery times, and schedule deliveries when you will be home, or a trusted neighbor can safely secure your packages.

Opt for In-Store Pickups: Consider selection the “pick up in store” option when checking out with online retailers that have a physical location nearby. Not only does this deter package theft, but it allows for the convenience of picking up your item at your own convenience.

Request Discreet Packaging: Many online retailers allow for the option of discreet packaging which does not reveal the contents of what is delivered.

Install Security Cameras: Investing in security cameras which cover the area of your home where packages are normally delivered, such as the front porch or steps. This could discourage potential thieves when a camera is clearly visible and can provide you extra security when away from home.

Report Suspicious Activity: If you notice any suspicious individuals in your neighborhood, or behaving strangely around you or your neighbors’ doorsteps, report it to the police department immediately. Sharing information about potential thieves can help police take necessary actions to prevent future thefts.

Your Colonial Heights Police Department is committed to keeping our community safe and secure. As a result, we will aggressively investigate any reported crimes of “porch piracy” in our jurisdiction and will work to bring these culprits to justice. Let’s work together to stop these thieves before they have a chance to make us or one of our neighbors a victim.

ARE YOU ON A LIMITED/FIXED INCOME? IS YOUR HOME IN NEED OF REPAIRS?

The City's Home Repair Program is a HUD-sponsored grant program to assist low to moderate-income residents with repairs and upgrades such as (but not limited to):

* Roof replacements and repairs * Front porch replacements and repairs * Electric amp upgrades and outlet replacement

* The sealing of windows, doors, and crawl spaces * Installation of deadbolt locks and flood lights

* Conversion of bathtubs to showers to prevent slips and falls * Conversion of carpet to hard surface floors to prevent slips and falls *

* Installation of bath room grab bars, shower seats, and raised toilets

HEATER SAFETY TIPS



The days are getting shorter, the leaves are beginning to turn, and the mornings/evenings are cooler. Fall must be right around the corner and it’s time for sitting around camp fires, plugging in portable heaters, and firing up the fire places and wood stoves. Though it can be a special time for many, it also brings some safety issues to light.

Heating fires in homes remained the second leading cause of residential fires in 2021. An estimated 32,200 fires in the home were reported in our country. These fires accounted for an estimated 190 fatalities, 625 injuries, and \$442 million in property loss. Portable heaters of various types only caused 3% of residential heating fires but they accounted for 41% of fatal heating fires in our homes. What can we do to prevent becoming a statistic?

Maintain a 36’ clearance from all heat sources (i.e., space heaters, fireplaces, wood stoves, etc.)

Turn off space heaters when leaving the room and before going to bed.

Only plug space heaters directly into wall outlets and never into power strips or extension cords.

Have your chimneys/wood stoves inspected and cleaned if needed.

Only use proper fuels in heating appliances; no paper in wood stoves, no gasoline!

Above all, please be sure you have working smoke detectors in your home. Change your batteries as needed and test them monthly. In a national study, only 56% of homes that experienced heating-related fires had working smoke detectors. 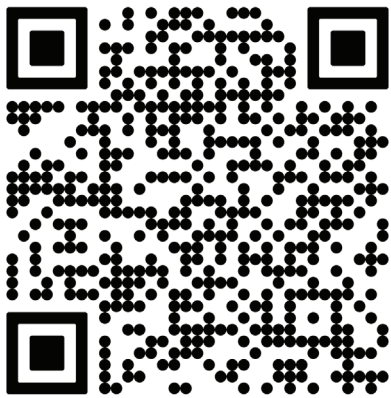

What is Bulky Waste?

Bulky Waste is ANYTHING that doesn't fit in the trash cart such as:

- Bagged Leaves & Yard Waste (Must be bundled/cut to 4ft length and weigh less than 65 lbs)
- Furniture
- Appliances
- Extra bags of trash.



What is **NOT** Bulky Waste?

Items that will NOT be collected as Bulky Waste include:

- Construction Waste (Lumber, wire, sheetrock, bricks, shingles, pipes, concrete, paving material, et.)
- Tires
- Car or Lithium Batteries
- Hazardous Waste
- Loose Trash



How to schedule Bulky Waste Services?

If your Bulky Waste items will fit in the bed of a FULL-SIZED pickup truck, and you wish for your items to be collected for the next REGULAR trash collection day then:

Visit CVWMA.com/ch-trash-service or call 804-340-0900 to schedule your FREE Bulky Waste Collection.

ALL requests must be made prior to 2pm the day before regular trash collection.

Any larger loads will be considered **SPECIAL BULKY WASTE** and will cost \$125 to remove. You must request this service and pay this fee prior to receiving this service.

Water Meter Notification



Property owners and occupants are legally required to keep their water meters clear of debris, shrubbery, home decor, vehicles, mulch, garbage cans, tall grass, plants, or other objects that partially or completely obstruct access to meters. Although the majority of Colonial Heights property owners are compliant with the requirement to keep their meters clear of obstructions, City Meter Readers encounter certain obstructed meters. The obstructions cause Meter Readers to work less efficiently and require them to place a notice on the building door with an explanation about what prevented a reading. Let's all do our part to keep costs low by regularly maintaining the area around your meters to ensure easy access.
