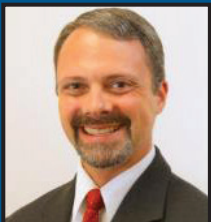

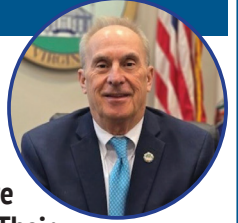

## Colonial Heights Fire/EMS Community Safety Reminders

### Grilling Safety

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling.

#### SAFETY TIPS

Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be PROPANE Grills used outdoors.

>> The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.

>> Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.

>> Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.

>> Never leave your grill unattended.

>> Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.



#### CHARCOAL GRILLS

There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.

If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.

Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.

There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.

When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

#### PROPANE GRILLS

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

**The Colonial Heights Fire and EMS Department want to also remind our community to keep ALL medications secured and away from children. Medication lock boxes are available upon request at the Public Library along with medication deactivation kits.**

## FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

I am writing this in hopes that you have already received your 2025 personal property bill in the mail from Billing & Collections. We are in our fifth year of using our new tax software and hope that this billing cycle many of the issues we have had in the past have been cleared up. If not, always remember that there is nothing that we cannot fix if it is not correct. In addition, incorrect assessments do not have to be rectified by the June 5 due date. We continue to use the information received electronically from DMV and we all know that information may not always be completely accurate, so we continue to rely on you telling us all year long when you do buy and sell or otherwise dispose of vehicles or other personal property. Please be sure that not only your correct address shows on your vehicle registration, but, also the Garage Jurisdiction just below your address. It should say Colonial Heights City.

I continue to request that you let us know about any changes to your address or what you own as soon after they occur as possible. It remains our goal to get it right every time and we need your help in doing so. 100% disabled Veterans, one passenger vehicle that you own or co-own is exempt from personal property tax. Please keep us updated on which vehicle you would like exempt if you own more than one. You may still be billed for the License Fee depending on what type of plate you have. Active Duty military with an out of state HOR, you must provide us with a current LES to be exempt from personal property taxes and license fees. As always, remember, there is nothing that we cannot fix or make correct before you make any payments.

### GENERAL REMINDERS FOR US ALL

- Elderly and Disabled Real Estate Tax Relief applications are due by March 31, however, we will assist you even after that date. You must provide the documents noted on the application.
- New business owners are required to get a Business License prior to opening.
- All businesses in the City should now have a renewed 2025 Business License.
- You must keep your name and address updated at DMV. Changes are required by State Law within 30 days. You can do that on the DMVNow website or visit our new DMV Select located in City Hall
- Colonial Heights does not pro-rate personal property tax. If you owned the vehicle or other property on January 1, 2025, you will pay taxes for the entire year in Colonial Heights regardless of when you move or when you sold it. In addition, personal property purchased in 2025 will not get taxed until 2026.

The City's Home Repair Program is a HUD-sponsored grant program to assist low to moderate-income residents with repairs and upgrades such as (but not limited to):

- Roof replacements and repairs
- Front porch replacements and repairs
- Electric amp upgrades and outlet replacement
- The sealing of windows, doors, and crawl spaces
- Installation of deadbolt locks and flood lights
- Installation of bath room grab bars, shower seats, and raised toilets
- Conversion of bathtubs to showers to prevent slips and falls
- Conversion of carpet to hard surface floors to prevent slips and falls

## WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT BULKY WASTE

Household items that don't fit in your trash cart are considered bulky waste—furniture, appliances, mattresses/box springs, yard waste and limbs, or extra bags of trash.



### WHEN IS BULKY WASTE COLLECTED?

In the City of Colonial Heights, bulky waste is collected every Wednesday, the same day as household trash.

### SCHEDULE A PICKUP

Requests for bulky waste pickup can be made by calling or emailing CVWMA. You may also use the customer portal at [CVWMA.com](http://CVWMA.com).  
**Schedule by 2:00pm Tuesday in order to be serviced the following day.**

Requests made after 2:00pm on Tuesdays will be scheduled for the following week.

### GUIDELINES

Standard bulky waste collection is included with your city trash service.

- ✓ A single load must be able to fit in the bed of a standard-size pickup truck. Larger loads will require a fee.
- ✓ Yard waste and limbs must be bagged or bundled. Bundles can be no longer than 4 feet and no more than 65 lbs.
- ✓ No construction or renovation debris. Evictions and move outs are not eligible for this program.
- ✓ No wooden pallets, no glass panes, no window or door frames. No household hazardous wastes.

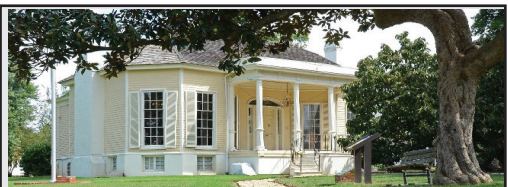


## SENIOR CENTER EVENTS

## Smart Stormwater Summer Lawn Care

### Don't do these!

- 1 Use a lot of fertilizers on your lawn
- 2 Use a lot of pesticides and herbicides on your lawn
- 3 Put leaves and grass clippings in ditches or gutters where they can get washed into the storm sewer system



### Choose these instead!

- Mulch leaves and grass back into your lawn with a mulching mower - this adds nutrients back into your lawn naturally!
- Provide for songbirds that want to eat bugs and dandelion seeds!
- Pile leaves and grass clippings in biodegradable bags for collection at the curb, OR do mulch them and skip this step altogether!



### WASHING YOUR CAR

Designate an area for vehicle washing that discharges to gravel, grass, or other permeable surface that allows water to infiltrate. Better yet, wash your vehicle on the lawn - you will clean your car, filter the wash water, and water your grass all at the same time!

Use hoses with nozzles that automatically turn off when left unattended. Avoid using acid-based wheel cleaners or engine degreasers unless the waste can be properly disposed of.

Reduce the amount of soap used by using a bucket of soapy water to re-soap rags or sponges rather than adding more soap directly to rags or sponges. Use products labeled "non-toxic," "phosphate free", and "biodegradable".

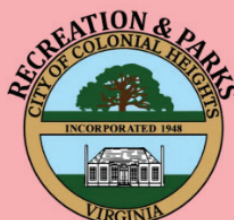
