

**ACTIONS
COLONIAL HEIGHTS CITY COUNCIL
AUGUST 25, 2009**

Council advanced an ordinance pertaining to the location of massage clinics to the Work Session on September 15th for public hearing on first reading with second reading to be held at the Regular Meeting on October 13th.

Council advanced a proposal with regard to the Southpark/I-95 Interchange and West Roslyn Road design option to the Work Session on September 15th, with estimated construction costs and a framework for cost allocation to private sector developments to be reported at that time.

Council advanced a draft of Public-Private Educational Facilities and Infrastructure Act (PPEA) guidelines to the Work Session on September 15th, and staff was asked to obtain other guidelines for the Work Session.

Council advanced consideration of a draft ordinance to amend Section 258-52 of the City Code relating to transient occupancy taxes, with changes, to the Regular Meeting on September 8th.

Council advanced a draft ordinance relating to graffiti, with changes.

Council advanced a draft ordinance relating to license taxes for itinerant food merchants, with changes. (This matter will be referred to the Planning Commission for consideration.)

Council advanced a draft ordinance relating to real estate tax abatement as an economic development incentive.

Council directed the preparation of a formal resolution expressing opposition to United States Senate Bill 1611 regarding collective bargaining agreements for public safety employees to be sent to Senators Warner and Webb and Congressman Forbes.

Council authorized the City Attorney to settle the federal case of John H. Miner v. New Chinamen's Buffet and Jeffrey W. Faries, Chief of Police.
