ADOPTION OF:

ORDINANCE NO. 13-15

(Second Reading) To amend §§244-7, 244-8, 244-9 and 244-12 of Chapter 244 of the Colonial Heights City Code, which relate to the removal of unsafe substances and the cutting of excessively high grass, weeds, or other foreign growth.

ORDINANCE NO. 13-FIN-11

(Second Reading) to amend the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014, to appropriate \$88,783, which consists of \$20,000 in donation funds received from a patron to purchase artwork for the Library; \$12,000 in funds from the Department of Conservation and Recreation's Pocahontas Program to the Office on Youth; \$3,783 to be transferred from Legislative to fund training for the City Treasurer; and \$53,000 to be transferred from the Fund Balance to fund renovations at Flora Hill Park.

To amend the Capital Projects Fund Budget to appropriate \$173,000, which consists of \$110,000 in General Fund Matching monies for the Appomattox Greenway Trail; and \$63,000 for renovations at flora Hill Park from the General Fund (53,000) and from donations (\$10,000).

ORDINANCE NO. 13-FIN-12

(First Reading) To amend the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014, to appropriate \$12,500, which consists of \$12,500 in donation funds received from a citizen and a business to purchase equipment for the Fire Department. To amend the Capital Projects Fund Budget to appropriate \$49,005 from a Cameron Foundation grant, for the Appomattox Greenway Trail.
