ADOPTION OF:

AN ORDINANCE NO 14 -17 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

(First Reading) To amend and reordain Sections 51-2, 51-40, 51-43, 51-47, 51-49, 51-51, 51-54, 51-77, 51-79, and 51-82 of Chapter 51, Personnel Policies and Grievance Procedures, of the Code of the City of Colonial Heights.

AN ORDINANCE NO 14 -18 (PASS)

(First Reading) To amend the General Plan Class and Salary Range so as to include the grade assignment for Cross-Connection Control Technician and to revise the job classification for Assistant Director of Public Works - Engineering, Building Maintenance Technician, Cross-Connection Control Technician, Facilities/Groundskeeper II, Public Works Foreman, public Works Heavy Equipment Operator, and Public Works Technician.

AN ORDINANCE NO 14-FIN-14 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

(Second Reading) To amend the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2015, to appropriate funds in the aggregate

amount of \$173,327; which consists of an appropriation of \$10,000 in Restricted Fund Balance - Police, for acquiring and equipping a seized vehicle for the agency and replacing a mobile phone forensics system; \$54,999 in funding from the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice, with matching School and City funding for the addition of an elementary School Resource Officer; \$1,400 in funding from the Virginia Department of emergency Management to purchase a cabinet for the Fire and EMS Department; \$48,044 in additional State funding changes, grants, and intergovernmental reimbursement; reduction of \$70,017 in School transfer to correct budgeted amounts; and appropriation of \$128,901 in Restricted Fund balance 0 Streets, for local matching funds for the Turn Lane at Temple and Dimmock;

To amend the Capital Projects Fund Budget to appropriate \$128,901 from local funds to the Temple Avenue/Dimmock Parkway Left Turn Lane Project.

AN ORDINANCE NO 14-FIN-15 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

(Second Reading) To amend the General Fund Budget for the Fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, to appropriate funds in the aggregate amount of \$70,000, which consists of an appropriation of \$35,000 in Restricted Fund Balance - Police and the reappropriation of Contingencies in the amount of \$35,000, for acquiring and equipping officers with body cameras.

AN ORDINANCE NO 14-14 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

(Second Reading) To change the land use classification of an approximate 1.706 acre tract consisting of parcel identification number 54000200001 on the Land Use and Transportation Plan map, which is part of the City Comprehensive Plan (i.e., Master Plan), from "Low Density Residential", to "General Commercial and Shopping Centers".

AN ORDINANCE NO 14-15 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

(Second Reading) To change the zoning classification of an approximate 1.706 acre tract consisting of parcel identification number 54000200001 from "RL Low Density Residential District" to GB General Business District" and to amend the Zoning Map accordingly.

AN ORDINANCE NO 14-FIN-16 (NO ACTION TAKEN)

(First Reading) To amend the General Fund Budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, to appropriate funds in the aggregate amount of \$426,168, which consists of a re-appropriation of \$388,918 in encumbered FY 2014 funds as required under the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) for budgetary reporting purposes; appropriating \$36,000 of reserved Police savings for reallocation to non-career development eligible positions; \$750 of donations from the Colonial Heights Moose for the medical care at the Animal Shelter and the Kids After School Program; and \$550 from the Partnership for Nonprofit Excellence for a new City HandsOn Youth GoLead Project led by the Office on Youth.

A RESOLUTION NO 14-54 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

Requesting the Commonwealth Transportation Board to establish a project to improve the Boulevard streetscape from A Avenue to Temple Avenue.

A RESOLUTION NO 14-55 (UNANIMOUS PASS)

Requesting the Commonwealth Transportation Board to fund a phase of the Colonial Heights Appomattox River Greenway Trail.
