ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC ADDRESSING THE COUNCIL SHALL APPROACH THE LECTERN, GIVE HIS NAME AND ADDRESS IN AN AUDIBLE TONE OF VOICE FOR THE RECORD, AND ADDRESS THE COUNCIL AS A BODY RATHER THAN SPEAK TO ANY MEMBER. UNLESS FURTHER TIME IS GRANTED BY COUNCIL, ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC SHALL ADDRESS THE COUNCIL FOR A MAXIMUM OF FIVE (5) MINUTES, REGARDLESS OF THE NUMBER OF ISSUES HE DESIRES TO DISCUSS. Emergency Home Repair Program

- Since 2005, the City has received **\$866,787** in CDBG funding and has been able to provided home repair grants to over **140** low to moderate income owner-occupied households citywide.





Consolidated Plan & Action Plan

2015-2019 Consolidated Plan, which includes the 2015 Annual Action Plan, identifies how the City will utilize this year's allocation of U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funds and serves as an application for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds.

- Consolidated Plan covers a five (5) year period beginning July 1, 2014 and ending June 30, 2019
- Annual Action Plan covers a one (1) year period beginning July 1, 2015 and ending June 30, 2015.

Goal 1: **To Preserve existing housing stock**

Emergency Home Repair Program

Eligible activities or repairs include but are not limited to the following:

- Unsafe electrical, heating or plumbing systems,
- Faulty roofs,
- Faulty porches and steps that present a safety risk, and
- Lead-based paint testing.

Ineligible activities consist of any unnecessary physical improvements, any repairs of a cosmetic nature, repairs to sheds, and repairs to garages or any structure not attached to the living unit.

Analysis of Impediments Fair Housing Choice (AI)

- Required by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for localities receiving federal housing and community development funds
- The overall goal is to review and access impediments to fair housing within the City of Colonial Heights



The Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice (AI)

The Federal Fair Housing Law states that impediments to fair housing choice are any actions, omissions, or decisions that restrict housing choice or the availability of housing because of

- **race,**
- **color,**
- **religion,**
- **national origin,**
- **sex,**
- **familial status, and**
- **handicap or disability**

Virginia also recognizes **elderliness** as a protected class.



2008 Analysis of Fair Housing Impediment Choice

Impediments Found:

- 1. Older owner-occupied residential properties in need of costly repairs**
- 2. Unmet accessibility needs**
- 3. Sub-standard residential rental properties**
- 4. Zoning language**
- 5. General Need for More Fair Housing Awareness**
- 6. Need for Increased Awareness in Real Estate and Construction Field**



2015 Analysis of Fair Housing Impediment Choice

Impediments Found:

1. Unmet accessibility needs
2. Sub-standard residential rental properties
3. General Need for More Fair Housing Awareness
4. High income levels and fees requested to rent housing
5. Lack of minority owned housing
6. Lack of available vacant land in Colonial Heights to build affordable housing.






Trailer Violation



Trash/Debris in Yard


