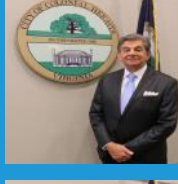

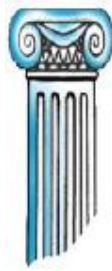

CHPD Continues Commitment to Accountability and Professionalism

In June of 2020, President Donald Trump signed Executive Order 13929, more commonly known as “Standards for Certification on Safe Policing for Safe Communities”. This Executive Order requires that each and every police department meet several standards of policing in order to meet newly enacted requirements of police reform as well as be eligible to receive federal grant money.

One of the main requirements of this order is that a specific agency either be accredited by an approved independent credentialing body or be in the process of obtaining accreditation. This Executive Order does not expire and requires each agency to meet the requirements of the order each and every year. Here at the Colonial Heights Police Department, we are extremely proud to report that not only are we currently in compliance with this Executive Order, but we have also complied for nearly a decade. In 2012, our agency was the first in the Tri-Cities to meet all the requirements of the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission. In January 2013, we received our initial accreditation certificate. In 2016, we received our first reaccreditation certificate and are now extremely excited to report that in January of 2021, we were once again successfully assessed for our second reaccreditation certificate.

During each assessment, an on-site team of certified assessors spends three days inspecting the agency, interviewing and riding with officers, reading policy and reviewing four years of “proofs of compliance” for more than 700 standards. Agencies like ours that choose to enter into the agreement for accreditation will find that it requires a commitment and a team effort from not only the organization, but also the community and our local leaders in order to be successful. According to the Virginia Law Enforcement Professional Standards Commission, agencies and their communities benefit from the program because of the following:

“Accreditation increases the law enforcement agency’s ability to prevent and control crime through more effective and efficient delivery of law enforcement services to the community it serves. Accreditation enhances community understanding of the law enforcement agency and its role in the community as well as its goals and objectives. Citizen confidence in the policies and practices of the agency is increased. Accreditation, in conjunction with the philosophy of community policing, commits the agency to a broad range of programs (such as crime prevention) that directly benefit the public. Accreditation creates a forum in which police and citizens work together to control and prevent crime. This partnership will help citizens to understand the challenges that confront law enforcement. Law enforcement will, in turn, receive clear direction from the community about its expectations. Thus, a common set of goals and objectives will be arrived at and implemented.”

Before there was ever an Executive Order, our commitment to be an accredited agency was ingrained in our agency’s culture. We soundly believe that accreditation demonstrates to our citizens that we are committed to being a professional police department and it creates a working environment that our employees can be proud of.

Even though this assessment is completed, our commitment never stops. From here, we move forward in complying with the requirements for our next assessment in 2025. We are excited about the future of policing and the direction of our agency. We are also proud to be one of more than 100 agencies in Virginia that are either accredited or are working towards making their agency and community the best it can be.

The City is continuing the implementation of a new financial system, which enhances several customer services. Customers received the new format utility bills in the fall. Based on customer feedback, we will be revising these bills with larger type and a slightly changed format in the next few months. Customers are also able to sign up for direct debit and e-billing for their utility bills as well by contacting the Utility Billing office at 520-9288.

The new system will also utilize new payment screens for utility billing and taxes that will allow customers to look up their bill amounts and pay online.

FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

2021 will be a year of change for many reasons. Here in the Commissioner's Office and in other offices that handle tax assessments and tax collections, we will be operating with a new software package that will eventually be more efficient and user friendly. While we are in the transition and learning process, some things may take a bit longer to process and we might encounter a few more errors. Just remember, there is nothing that we cannot fix or make correct, so please be patient as we navigate these new waters. It will get smoother, I promise.

Due dates will remain the same, tax rates remain the same and what you must do as citizens and taxpayers remains the same.

- By now you should have returned your "Blue Form" with any changes to personal property bought or sold.
- It is the taxpayer who is responsible for notifying this office of new purchases as well as personal property sold.
- New business owners are required to get a Business License prior to opening.
- Renewal of existing Business Licenses is required by March 1
- Elderly or Disabled Real Estate Tax Relief applications should be submitted by March 31 for review.
- You must keep your name and address updated at DMV. Changes are required by State Law within 30 days. You can do that on the DMVNow website.
- Colonial Heights does not pro-rate personal property tax. If you owned the vehicle or other property on January 1, 2021, you will pay taxes for the entire year in Colonial Heights regardless of when you move or when you sold it.

Yard Sale Information

Colonial Heights City Ordinance 187-19 states that a license for yard or garage sales is required. The license is available at the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office, 201 James Avenue, City Hall during regular business hours (8:30 am to 5:00 pm, Monday through Friday). The cost for the license is \$5.00. Contact the Commissioner of the Revenue's Office at (804) 520-9280 for more information.

No sales are allowed on Sunday. The Yard Sale license includes a Temporary sign permit. The list of licensed yard sales will be posted on the City website not later than Friday at 4:00 pm. In order to be included in the on-line list, the host must obtain a yard sale license no later than 3:00 pm on the Friday prior to the yard sale.

Be Weather-Ready

What's the Difference – Watch and Warning

As spring storms are upon us now is a good time to remind ourselves of the difference between a storm WATCH and a storm WARNING.

A WATCH is issued when severe storms are possible in or near the watch area. It does not mean that they will occur. This pertains to severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, winter storms and even flooding. This is a time to stay Weather-Ready and listen to local news or a weather radio for updates. A watch area is typically large, covering numerous counties. Be ready to act quickly! Be Alert! Be Prepared!

On the other hand, a WARNING is issued when a storm is imminent or indicated by weather radar. This is a time to act! For example, if a tornado warning is issued seek shelter immediately. A warning area typically encompasses a much smaller area. The City will sound the warning siren during these situations. If a warning is issued, seek shelter, and tune to your local news or weather radio for updates.

Spring Cleaning for Safety

Spring time means spring cleaning. In this case we are talking about cleaning out your house or apartment as items no longer used, needed, or just plain waste. Some people call this hoarding. We are not just looking at the hoarding, but storage in general. Do you have a person in your life who may be a hoarder or have excessive storage? This condition is where a person has persistent difficulty discarding personal possessions. The large amount of possessions fills the home and prevents the normal use of the space. Living space, attic, garage, and closets becomes cluttered. It may be unusable. This brings in distress, emotional health, and general wellbeing concerns for the person.



Why Hoarding or Unnecessary Storage Increases Fire Risks:

- Cooking is unsafe if flammable items are close to the stove or oven.
- Heating units may be too close to things that can burn. They might also be placed on unstable surfaces. If a heater tips over into a pile, it can cause a fire.
- Electrical wiring may be old or worn from the weight of piles. Pests could chew on wires. Damaged wires can start fires.
- Open flames from smoking materials or candles in a home with excess clutter are very dangerous.
- Blocked pathways and exits may hinder escape from a fire.

How Hoarding or Unnecessary Storage Impacts First Responders:

- Hoarding puts first responders in harm's way.
- Firefighters cannot move swiftly through a home filled with clutter.
- Responders can be trapped in a home when exits are blocked. They can be injured by objects falling from piles.
- The weight of the stored items, especially if water is added to put out a fire, can lead to building collapse.
- Fighting fires is very risky in a hoarding home. It is hard to enter the home to provide medical care. The clutter impedes the search and rescue of people and pets.

How Can You Help Reduce the Risk of Fire Injury?

- When talking to a person who hoards, focus on safety rather than the clutter. Be empathetic. Match the person's language. If they call it hoarding, then you can call it hoarding.
- Help the residents make a home safety and escape plan. Stress the importance of clear pathways and exits. Practice the plan often. Exit routes may change as new items are brought into the home.
- Install working smoke alarms in the home. Test them at least once a month.
- Reach out to community resources such as churches or civic organizations. Talk to members of the fire department to alert them of your concerns.

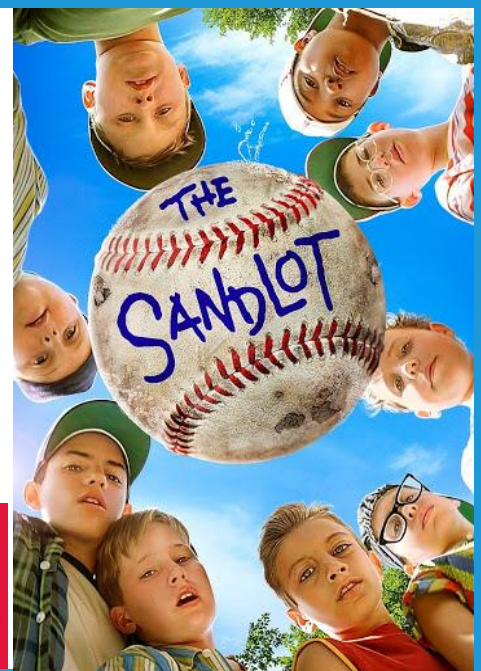
