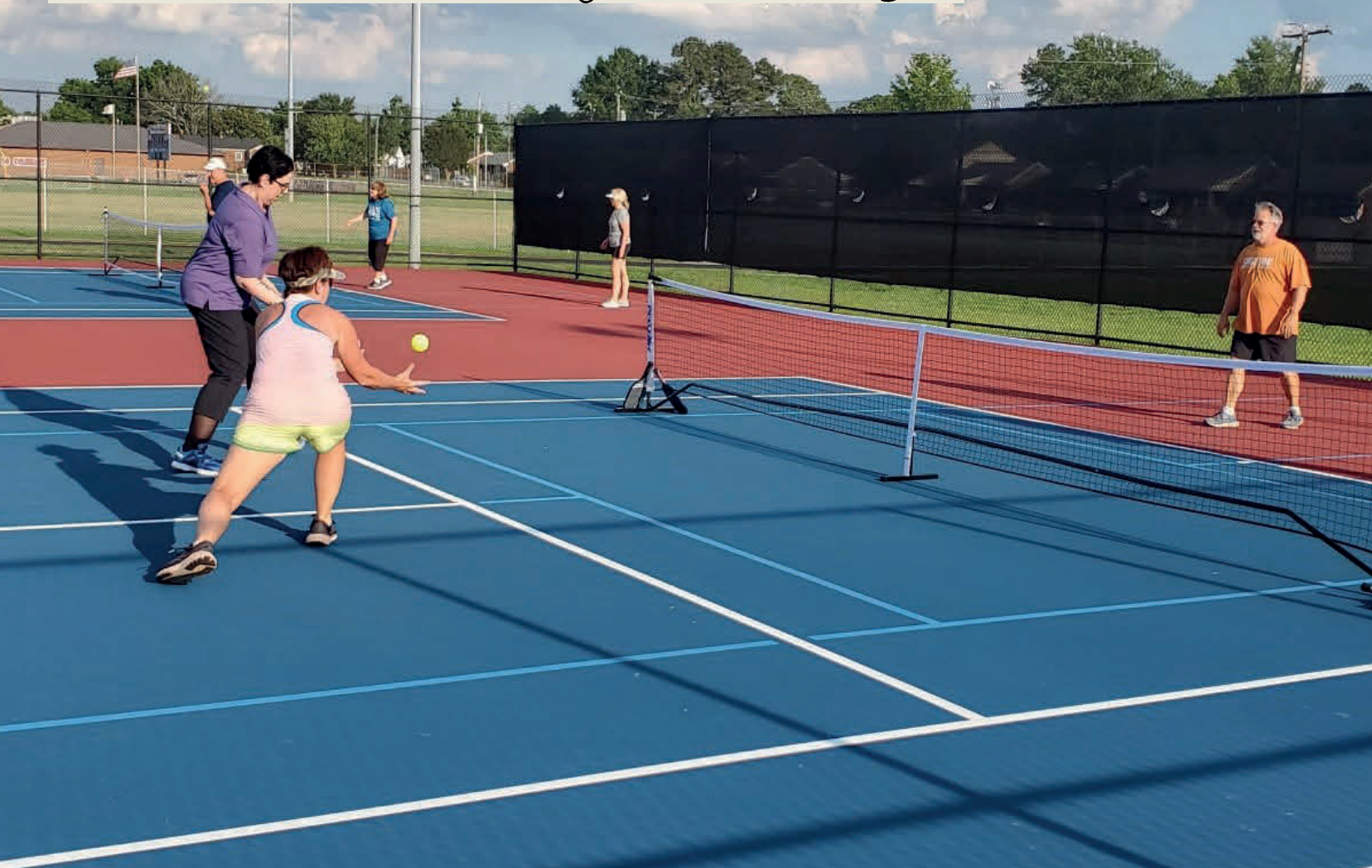

COUNCIL COLUMN

Greetings fellow citizens of Colonial Heights!

Summer is my favorite season of the year, but with fall, we welcome new beginnings as children and faculty head back to school eager to accomplish new things. I am, personally, looking forward to greeting a new wave of students at Longwood University. Over the last couple of months, we have been able to return to our normal lifestyle as mask restrictions and social distancing regulations were lifted across the Commonwealth. Our youths have resumed participation in sports from swimming to baseball, and we enjoyed the celebratory fireworks for Independence Day.

The last year was certainly full of challenges. I am pleased to say that while we experienced a reduction last year in meals, sales, and lodging taxes due to shutdowns, our city was able to financially recover, and we look forward to a prosperous 2021-2022 year. The City of Colonial Heights' adopted budget for the 2021-2022 year resolved compression issues that several departments across the city have been facing, in particular our public safety to include Communications, EMS, Fire, and Police.

You may have noticed the closure of portions of Conduit Rd. as we made significant repairs to our infrastructure. We are continuing to make necessary repairs and plan to begin more proactive replacements across the city, such as replacing the main pump station valve and performing sewer replacements at Hill Place.

Our Capital Improvement Plan includes some of the following projects that may, also, affect our roads and traffic:

- Lexington Dr. outfall and storm sewer repairs
- Boulevard at Temple Ave. intersection improvements
- Boulevard at Westover intersection improvements
- Branders Bridge right turn lane extension
- Colonial Heights High School sidewalks, and
- Animal Shelter entrance improvements

We have a number of businesses coming to the city, such as Crumbl Cookies and Mission BBQ. Be on the lookout for food trucks, since the recent ordinance changes now allow business owners to apply for quarterly permits to have a food truck on their property. With the return to normal business operations, be sure to check out upcoming fall activities within our Recreation and Parks programs.

It has been an honor to serve you these last few months. Feel free to contact me with any comments or questions. I will always make time to hear your concerns and look for creative solutions as we, as a council, strive to ensure Colonial Heights is a great place to work, live, and raise a family.

Emergency Communications Division

Say Hello to Cell Phone Sally

The Colonial Heights Emergency Communications division recently gained a new team member to help Public Safety teach the significance of knowing how to dial 9-1-1. Meet Cell Phone Sally. She's made the long journey from Texas to relocate to her new home in Colonial Heights. Cell Phone Sally even has her very own Facebook, Twitter, and YouTube channel. Her message is to encourage children and adults to verify their cell phone number, as well as identify landmarks when making a call to 9-1-1 on a cellular device. This way, she knows exactly where to send her Police, Fire, and EMS friends.



Cell Phone Sally loves nothing more than visiting local schools and daycares to teach kids how to call 9-1-1 in an emergency. She wants everyone to know what the Communications Officers will want to know when they call 9-1-1. Most importantly, know where you are; either the address, name of the business, or close-by businesses/landmarks so Sally can have her friends respond to aid you as fast as possible. Sally also wants everyone to know/verify their phone number, that way, if the line gets disconnected, someone can call you back if needed.

Cell Phone Sally similarly wants everyone to know that even if a cell phone is disconnected, you can still use it to call 9-1-1 to get the assistance you need. However, if a disconnected cell phone is used, Communications Officers are unable to use their extra tools to help locate you, which is why it is vital to know where you are.

What are these extra tools? Cell Phone Sally and her friends can use RapidSOS to assist in getting a general location for where you are. RapidSOS is a browser-based tool used to receive device location and additional data. Cell Phone Sally strongly encourages everyone to update their cell phone software, as this aids in getting a more exact location when you call 9-1-1. It is also important to know that if you dial 9-1-1 accidentally, it is ok, just don't hang up and let us know it was an accident. However, if you do, Sally will have her friends try to call you back to make sure everything is ok.

Cell Phone Sally is looking forward to settling into her new home and coming out to meet the citizens and guests of Colonial Heights. Sally and her friends will be out making public appearances soon, so if you see them, stop and say hello!

FROM THE BILLING & COLLECTIONS DEPARTMENT FALL 2021 - IMPORTANT DATES

- **November 1, 2021** – 2022 Dog and Cat tags available for purchase.
- **November 15, 2021** - The 2nd half of 2021 Real Estate Taxes are due. In order to avoid penalty and interest, these taxes must be paid by November 15, 2021.
- **December 6, 2021** - The 2nd half of 2021 Personal Property Taxes are due. In order to avoid penalty and interest, these taxes must be paid by this date. Please pay all Personal Property taxes by due date to avoid a Vehicle Registration Stop being placed at DMV.

Note: Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from any late charges

Payment by Mail OR Dropoff in Large White DROPBOX located in City Hall Parking Lot: If a receipt is needed, please provide a self-addressed stamped envelope along with your bill stub and payment placed together in a sealed envelope.

FROM THE COMMISSIONER OF THE REVENUE

Thank you to our citizens and businesses that were patient and understanding as we processed our first Personal Property bills utilizing our new financial software. We hope that we were proactive by revising the due date to July 30 and that it was not a severe inconvenience for you. Our goal is to always get it right every time and we know that did not happen this time, however, we are confident the things we discovered during this billing cycle will get us closer to getting it 100% right. 100% disabled Veterans, one passenger vehicle that you own or co-own is exempt from personal property tax. Please keep us updated on which vehicle you would like exempt if you own more than one. Active Duty military with an out of state HOR, you must provide us with a current LES to be exempt from personal property taxes and license fees. As always, remember, there is nothing that we cannot fix or make correct, so please be patient as we navigate these new waters. It will get smoother, I promise.

Due dates will remain the same, tax rates remain the same and what you must do as citizens and taxpayers remains the same.

- It is the taxpayer who is responsible for notifying this office of new purchases as well as personal property sold, not DMV or a car dealer.
- New business owners are required to get a Business License prior to opening.
- Renewal of existing Business Licenses is required by March 1
- You must keep your name and address updated at DMV. Changes are required by State Law within 30 days. You can do that on the DMVNow website.
- Colonial Heights does not pro-rate personal property tax. If you owned the vehicle or other property on January 1, 2021, you will pay taxes for the entire year in Colonial Heights regardless of when you move or when you sold it.

Neighborhood Leaf Removal Service

Fall 2021/Winter 2022

Convenient Service during Fall Season

The City of Colonial Heights Department of Public Works is pleased to announce that convenient leaf removal services will be provided in city neighborhoods again this year. Each fall, residents collect and stockpile loose leaves along city streets, which city crews remove and make available to local recycling businesses. During the 2020/21 season, city crews collected approximately 2,500 cubic yards of leaves.

Year Round Service Option

Bagged leaves are collected year round and may be placed at the curbside on regular trash collection days. The limit per collection day is 30 bags, each weighing no more than 50 pounds.

Neighborhood Service Areas

This year leaf removal operations will occur in three main service areas, each consisting of three to four neighborhoods. **Figure 1 (See Page 10)** shows the service areas and schedules. Signs will be installed on adjacent thoroughfares to let residents know in advance when service is scheduled in their area. Please note that the time for service in each area is subject to change depending on inclement weather conditions and other events beyond the City's control.

Scheduled Time of Service

Leaves will be collected and removed during the hours of 7:30 AM and 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday, beginning November 15, 2021 and ending February 14, 2022 except on holidays.

Preparing Leaves for City Collection

Residents are asked to place leaves along street frontages and roadsides one week before service is scheduled to begin in their neighborhood, ***as only one (1) pass will be made on each street during the scheduled collection service for the area.*** No leaves will be removed except during regularly scheduled times. Leaves that are not placed before regularly scheduled removal times will be removed during the next regularly scheduled service in the area. City crews cannot remove leaves from private property.

Avoid Mixing Leaves with Other Debris

Residents are asked to keep leaf piles free of tree branches, lumber, steel, rock, concrete or other debris. Hard objects mixed with leaves are hazardous and may damage leaf vacuum equipment causing unnecessary time and expense to repair or replace.

Neighborhood Parking During Leaf Removal Service

Residents can assist city leaf removal operations by keeping parked vehicles clear of leaf piles. The use of off-street parking is encouraged wherever available. "No Parking" signs may be used to restrict parking on neighborhood streets while city crews remove leaf piles. To avoid damaging personal property, city crews will not rake leaf piles out from under or between parked cars.

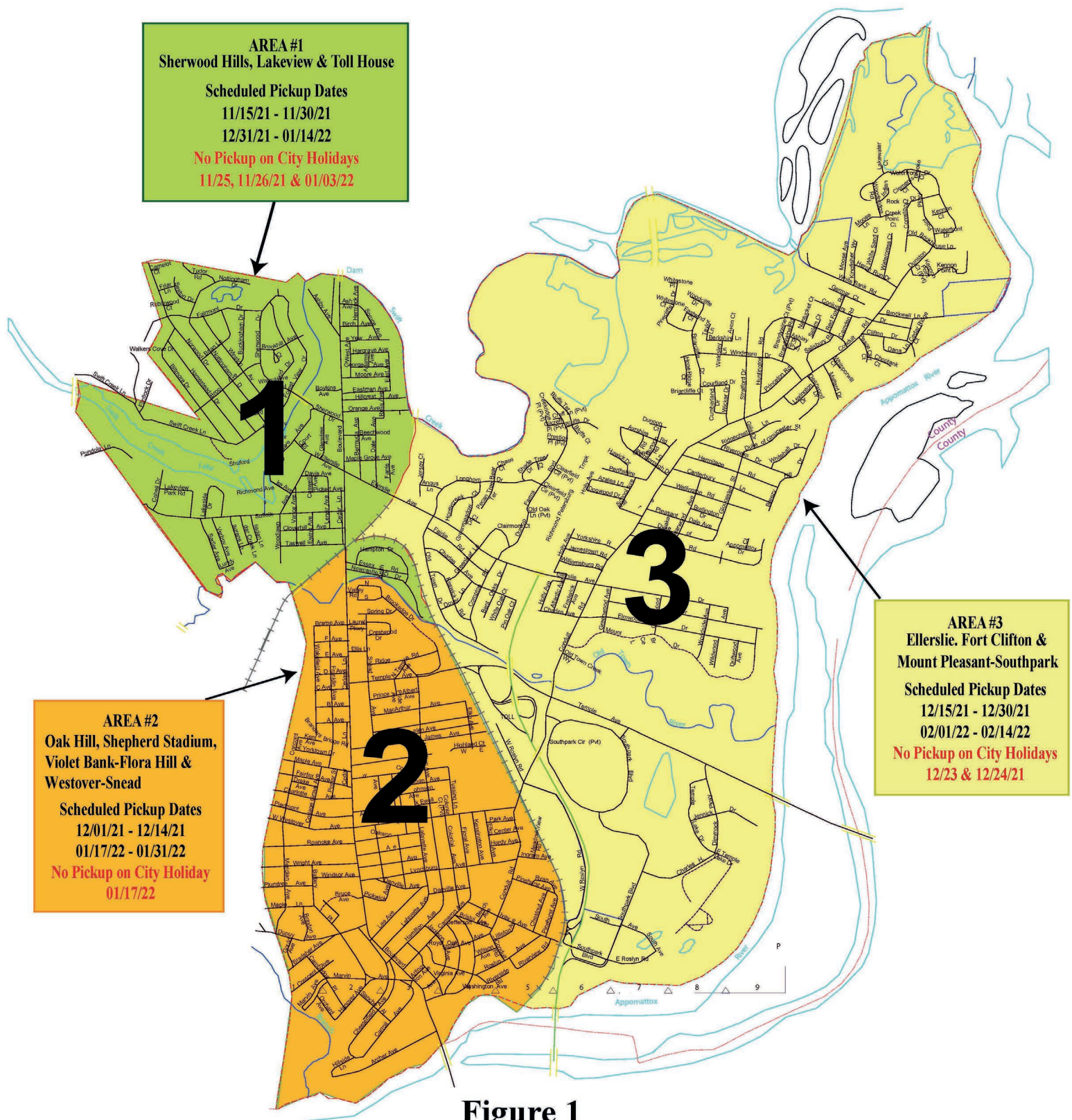

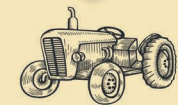
