

Transactions that can be conducted here include vehicle titles and registrations, license plates and decals, disabled parking placards, transcripts, voter registration applications, EZ Pass transponders, hunting and fishing licenses and more. We do not issue or renew driver's licenses, learner's permits, or ID cards.

Common Scams and How to Prepare for Them

Since the pandemic there have been numerous fraud schemes that have targeted the elderly population. According to a study by AARP these frauds have increased by seventy four percent since the pandemic. There are several schemes which utilize gift cards by either asking the victim to pay some type of phony financial obligation or by asking the victim to purchase gift cards and requesting the numbers off the back of the cards. Some of these financial obligations are in reference to an overdue power bill or delinquent taxes owed to the IRS. No financial institution or the IRS will ever ask you to use gift cards to satisfy your bill. Additionally, the IRS does not contact individuals and inform them about delinquent taxes or any outstanding warrants.

One common occurrence is that when these schemes are perpetrated, the fraudsters would almost immediately redeem the value of the gift cards, and in many instances, this is done from different states from where the gift card had been purchased making these types of cases difficult for law enforcement to investigate as there is no face to face interaction.



Although there are a wide variety of methods that scammers utilize, there are similarities in these schemes which community members should be cognizant of in order to avoid becoming a victim:

- You are asked to wire money to someone you do not know personally
- You are pressured to "act now!" or comply "immediately!"
- You are threatened over the phone with arrest or your services shut off
- You are told to pay bills or fines using a money-wire service or via a pre-paid cash or gift cards
- You have won a contest or sweepstakes you've never entered
- You have to pay a fee to receive your "prize" or a payment up front for investments or winnings
- You are being asked by a foreign dignitary to hold or transfer money in exchange for a reward
- Your personal information, especially your Social Security number, is requested over the phone or email

What to do if you suspect a scam

• If you think you are being called by a scammer, simply hang up, delete and block the email. There is no need to report the phone number, email address unless you have sent funds.

• Contact the institution in question: Call your bank or the agency to ask if an agent called you regarding your account. Most agencies are aware of scams and will be able to confirm if a call is legitimate.

• Check online: The Federal Trade Commission keeps lists of common scammers and a variety of tools to help consumers identify and report scams. There are also numerous consumer protection groups that offer tips on protecting yourself and your family against fraud. Visit the FTC online for more information at <https://www.ftc.gov/>

• Register for the Do Not Call List: The National Do Not Call Registry gives you a choice about whether to receive telemarketing calls at home. Most telemarketers should not call your number once it has been on the registry for 31 days. If they do, you can file a complaint at this Website. You can register your home or mobile phone for free. It's not a catch-all, but it can help. Visit <https://www.donotcall.gov/> for more information on how to register.

Home fires occur more in winter than in any other season. As you stay cozy and warm this winter, be fire smart!



Half of all home heating fires occur in December, January and February.




1 in every 7 home fires and **1 in every 5** home fire deaths involves heating equipment.



Keep anything that can burn **at least 3 feet** from any heat source like fireplaces, wood stoves, radiators or space heaters.



Keep portable generators **outside**, **away from windows**, and as far **away** from your home as possible.



Install and test carbon monoxide alarms **at least once a month**.



Plug only **1 heat-producing appliance** (like a space heater) into an electrical outlet at a time.



Have a qualified professional clean and inspect your chimney and vents **every year**.



Store cooled ashes in a tightly covered metal container, and keep it **outside at least 10 feet** from your home and any nearby buildings.





OFFICE ON YOUTH

Youth Advisory Council

Here in the community of Colonial Heights, the Office on Youth offers leadership programs such as the Youth Advisory Council also known as YAC. YAC is offered to students between the grades of 6-12th. YAC is extremely involved in the community and has participated in programs such as providing lunch for the Tri-Cities Work Camp program, participating in Colonial Heights High School Volunteer-a-thon and working with the community during back to school events, street and city clean ups and providing take home kits from the library. YAC currently accepts applications on a rolling basis and will meet the last Thursday of each month in Council Chambers at 6:30pm.

CADRE

CADRE is a volunteer civic organization that is dedicated to the prevention of substances abuse among the youth. CADRE addressed underage drinking, smoking and the illegal use of drugs. CADRE serves both the youth and adults of Colonial Heights. CADRE participates in community activities such as Project Sticker Shock and Youth Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Project (YADAPP).

Project Sticker Shock is a prevention program that involves the youth placing sticker warnings that address the penalties of furnishing alcohol to minors. The youth have been participating in the program since 2011. We collaborate with retailers and law enforcement officers with the hope to educate and raise awareness to furnishers and retailers.

YADAPP is a peer-led program for high school students to address the risk of underage substance use. YADAPP participants attend a week long summer kick-off conference that will assist with the developing of strategic prevention plans that will address underage drug and alcohol use in the schools and communities. Participants will meet and interact with their like-minded peers during classroom and breakout sessions, and will learn from motivational speakers. After the conferences YADAPP participants will plan to utilize their leadership and acquired knowledge to educate and prevent substance abuse.


Each robot circulates for 3 weeks and can be renewed for an additional three weeks. Please call the library at 520-9384 if you have questions.

What is Bulky Waste?

Bulk Waste is ANYTHING that doesn't fit in the trash cart such as:

- Bagged Leaves & Yard Waste (*Must be bundled/cut to 4ft length and weigh less than 65 lbs*)
- Furniture
- Appliances
- Extra bags of trash.



What is **NOT** Bulky Waste?

Items that will NOT be collected as Bulky Waste include:

- Construction Waste (Lumber, wire, sheetrock, bricks, shingles, pipes, concrete, paving material, et.)
- Tires
- Car or Lithium Batteries
- Hazardous Waste
- Loose Trash



How to schedule Bulky Waste Services?

If your Bulky Waste items will fit in the bed of a FULL-SIZED pickup truck, and you wish for your items to be collected for the next REGULAR trash collection day then:

- Visit CVWMA.com/ch-trash-service or call 804-340-0900 to schedule your FREE Bulky Waste Collection.
- ALL requests must be made prior to 2pm the day before regular trash collection.

Any larger loads will be considered SPECIAL BULKY WASTE and will cost \$125 to remove. You must request this service and pay this fee prior to receiving this service.


