

Dear Citizens,

As summer draws to a close, we want to take a moment to reflect on the wonderful season we've shared and look ahead to an exciting school year filled with new opportunities and projects in our community.

We hope you've enjoyed the sunny days, local events, and family time that summer brings. As students prepare to head back to school, we encourage everyone to embrace this transition with enthusiasm and optimism. Education is a cornerstone of our community, and we look forward to seeing our students flourish in the months ahead.

This year, we are excited to announce several projects and new businesses that will enhance our community. A big project to highlight is the reconstruction on Roanoke Avenue. The work will include new water and sewer lines, total reconstruction of the pavement, and sidewalk expansion.

Additionally, the City and VDOT began a federal-aid project to improve the intersection of Temple and Boulevard to mitigate congestion. The project will provide additional turn lanes from Route 1 onto Temple Avenue, a new traffic signal system with mast arms, curb & gutter, and ADA curb ramps. This project will help provide a safer intersection and provide the required capacity for future traffic volumes.

The City has completed pavement preservation operations in the neighborhoods surrounding North Elementary School. In addition, the City is planning to pave Hamilton Ave., Conduit Rd. from River Oaks, north to Heron Run, and various neighborhood streets north of Shepherd Stadium this year. Thank you for your patience as we continue to work to improve our streets that help make traveling in, around, and through Colonial Heights safer for everyone.

In addition to these city street improvement projects, we have several businesses to welcome to our community. Of those businesses, construction is currently underway for two additional carwash facilities. There is a new Flagstop Carwash being built on Charles Dimmock Parkway and GO Carwash is being built on the Boulevard, adjacent to KFC. You may have also noticed some construction taking place near the round-about off the Interstate 95/Temple Avenue exit which is for a new 121,372 square foot Self-Storage Facility located behind Hardees and the Circle-K gas station.

Additional businesses that have earmarked Colonial Heights as their home include Popeyes, Synergy PT, and a Home2Suites. I am grateful for the businesses that continue to serve our community and appreciate the opportunities for continued growth throughout the city. As we wrap up this season, I want to thank each of you for your continued support and engagement. Your involvement is what makes our community truly special.

I look forward to seeing how we can grow and thrive together in the coming months.

It's the most wonderful time of the year again, NEW LAWS for the Commonwealth of Virginia went into effect July 1, 2024! If you'd like to review the entirety of these, you can go to: [Bill Tracking - 2024 session > Legislation \(virginia.gov\)](#). While there are lots of new laws (and modifications to others), I thought I'd go over some of the laws that affect what is most dear to our community, our beloved pets.

To begin, the Virginia General Assembly has passed legislation to allow localities (like Colonial Heights) to create a registry of animal cruelty that is accessible to the public.

This provides that such a registry may include the names and relevant information of persons convicted of certain felony offenses for animal cruelty and that a person on such registry may request removal of his name after 15 years, provided that he/she has no additional felony convictions of an animal cruelty offense.

Next, an amendment to an existing animal cruelty law provides that any person convicted of felony cruelty to animals may be prohibited by the court from possession or ownership of companion or equine animals for life and any person convicted of misdemeanor cruelty to animals may be prohibited by the court from possession or ownership of such animals for a period of up to five years.

Under current law, such prohibition is limited to companion animals and a period equal to the statutory maximum period of incarceration. The new language also specifies that a court may order that any animal possessed or owned by such person may be disposed of by a local governing body or delivered to another person with a right of property in the animal. This new law further provides that any person who has his/her rights to possession or ownership of companion or equine animals prohibited pursuant to a felony conviction may petition the court where such conviction occurred for a restoration of his/her rights after five years from the date of conviction.

Finally, there is new legislation that extends the time for adjudication on dangerous dog cases.

This new language amends sections 3.2-6549 and 3.2-6540.03 to require the court, unless good cause is determined by the court, to hold the evidentiary hearing pursuant to the dangerous dog summons within 30 days or as soon as practicable from the issuance of the summons. Under current law, the court is required to hold such hearing not more than 30 days from the issuance of the summons.

*Installation of bath room grab bars, shower seats, and raised toilets

November 1, 2024 – Dog and Cat tags are now on sale. The City is now providing the issuance of a lifetime license for dogs and cats over four months of age. \$25.00 for an unneutered or unspayed dog or cat. \$10.00 for a neutered or spayed dog or cat. Must provide a current rabies certificate.

November 15, 2024 the 2nd half of 2024 Real Estate Taxes are due. In order to avoid penalty and interest, these taxes must be paid by November 15, 2024. Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from any late charges. Please mail or bring your bill with you when making payment.

December 5, 2024, the 2nd half of 2024 Personal Property Taxes are due. In order to avoid penalty and interest, these taxes must be paid by this date. Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from any late charges. Please mail or bring your bill with you when making payment. Please pay all Personal Property taxes by due date to avoid a Vehicle Registration Stop being placed at DMV.



NEIGHBORHOOD LEAF REMOVAL

FALL 2024/WINTER 2025



Convenient Service During Fall Season

The City of Colonial Heights Department of Public Works is pleased to announce that convenient leaf removal services will be provided in city neighborhoods again this year. Each fall, residents collect and stockpile loose leaves along city streets, which city crews remove and make available to local recycling businesses. During the 2023/24 season, city crews collected approximately **2,600 cubic** yards of leaves.

Bagged Leaves (Require Bulk Waste Service Request)

Bagged leaves that are not placed inside trash carts are considered "bulk waste".

- A bulk waste service request must be completed by 2:00pm on the Tuesday before collection.
- Call **CVWMA at (804)340-0900** or submit a bulk waste request online at <https://cvwma.com/cvwma-locations/colonial-heights/>
- Bagged leaves may be collected year round and may be placed at the curbside with regular trash cart on regular trash collection days if a bulk waste service request is submitted on-time.

Neighborhood Service Areas

Leaf removal operations will occur in four main service areas, each consisting of three to four neighborhoods. (See page 11 for service areas and schedules)

- Signs will be installed on adjacent thoroughfares to let residents know in advance when service is scheduled in their area.
- Service timeframes in each area are subject to change depending on inclement weather conditions and other events beyond the City's control.

Fall Curbside (Loose-Leaf) Collection Service Hours

Leaves will be collected and removed from 7:30 AM through 3:00 PM, Monday through Friday, beginning November 13, 2023 and ending February 29, 2024 except on holidays (weather delays may affect this collection schedule).

Preparing Leaves for City Collection

- Residents are asked to **place leaf piles behind the curb or behind the edge of pavement along the street** one week before service is scheduled to begin in their neighborhood, as **only one (1) pass** will be made on each street during the scheduled collection service for the area.
- Leaves that are not placed out before regularly scheduled removal times will be removed during the next regularly scheduled service in the area.
- City crews cannot remove leaves from private property, so leaf piles must be placed behind the curb or behind the edge of pavement along the street which is the city right-of-way.
- Leaf piles need to be free of tree branches, lumber, steel, rock, concrete or other debris. (Hard objects mixed with leaves are hazardous and may damage leaf vacuum equipment causing unnecessary time and expense to repair or replace.

Neighborhood Parking During Leaf Removal Service

Residents can assist city leaf removal operations by keeping parked vehicles clear of leaf piles. The use of off-street parking is encouraged wherever available. "No Parking" signs may be used to restrict parking on neighborhood streets while city crews remove leaf piles. To avoid damaging personal property, city crews will not take leaf piles out from under or between parked cars.






